

Update on REL section – December 2023

- REL currently has 237 members.
- REL shared a reception with three other ISA sections at the 2023 Toronto convention.
- Despite an initial allotment of REL's 14 panels at ISA 2024, the total REL panels have more than doubled through sponsorship.
- ISA 2024 Annual Convention will see REL with 29 panels on the program, 23 of which are cosponsored with at least one other section. 7 of the panels are roundtables.

REL Executive Committee Elections: Chair, Vice-Chair, Secretary in December 2023

The Religion & International Relations (REL) section of ISA requests nominations for the post of Chair, Vice-Chair and Secretary, for a term of two years from April 2024. Nominations must be submitted by December 08, 2023. Elections for the posts will be held on December 11-15, 2023.

When nominating someone for Chair, Vice-Chair and Secretary, please include a 200-word statement explaining why the nominee would make a suitable Chair or Vice-Chair of REL. Nominees may self-nominate. Do not nominate someone without their consent. All nominees must be REL members.

Responsibilities

The Chair's responsibilities include: call meetings and preside at them, coordinate section activities, oversee the Executive Committee, act as liaison with the ISA and with the REL membership, and be the official spokesperson of the REL.

The Vice Chair/Program Chair's responsibilities include: to assist the Chair in liaison activities and in preparing the Annual Report. The Vice Chair presents the report at the AGM. As Program Chair, she/he is responsible for organising REL-sponsored panels at the ISA annual convention.

Elections for the remaining executive member posts - Awards Chair, Communications Chair, and four Members-at-Large - will take place in 2025.
